Acts 15:22-23 22Then it pleased the apostles and elders, with the whole church, to send chosen men of their own company to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas, namely, Judas who was also named Barsabas, and Silas, leading men among the brethren. 4They wrote this letter by them: The apostles, the elders, and the brethren, To the brethren who are of the Gentiles in Antioch, Syria, and Cilicia: Greetings. Lord Jesus Christ.

Acts 15:24-29 ²⁶Since we have heard that some who went out from us have troubled you with words, mesettling your souls, saying, "You must be circumcised and keep the commandment. ²⁸It seemed good to expend the commandment. ²⁸It seemed good to expend you with our belowed Barnabas and Paul, ²⁸men who have risked their lives for the name of our Lord Jesus Christ: ²⁸We have therefore sent Judas and Silas, who will also report the same things by word of mouth. ²⁸For it seemed good to the Holy Spirit, and to us, to lay upon you no greate burden than these necessary things: ²⁸that you abstain from things offered to idols, from blood, from things offered to idols, from sexual immorally, if you keep yourselves from these, you will do well. Farewell.

Acts 15:30-35 30 So when they
were sent off, they came to
Antioch; and when they had
gathered the multitude together,
they delivered the letter. 31When
they had read it, they rejoiced
over its encouragement. 32Now
Judas and Silas, themselves
being prophets also, exhorted
and strengthened the brethren
with many words. 33And after
they had stayed there for a time,
they were sent back with
greetings from the brethren
to the apostles. 34However, it
seemed good to Silas to remain
there. 35 Paul and Barnabas also
remained in Antioch, teaching
and preaching the word of the
Lord, with many others also.

Acts 15:36-41 ²⁶Then after some days Paul said to Barnabas, "Let us now go back and visit our berthern in every city where we have preached the word of the Lord, and see how they are doing," ²⁸Now Barnabas was determined to take with them John called Mark. ²⁸But Paul insisted that they should not take with them the one who had departed from them in Pamphylia, and had not gone with them to the work. ²⁸Then the contention became so sharp that they parted from one another. And so Barnabas took Mark and sailed to Cyprus; ²⁸but Paul chose Silas and departed, being commended by the brethren to the grace of God. ²⁹And he went through Syria and Cilicia, strengthening the churches.

- Why was the contention sharp?
- What was the outcome of the contention?
