Acts 7:35-38 <sup>35</sup> "This Moses whom they rejected, saying, "Who made you a ruler and a judge?" is the one God sent to be a ruler and a deliverer by the hand of the Angel who appeared to him in the bush. <sup>36</sup> He brought them out, after he had shown wonders and signs in the land of Egypt, and in the Red Sea, and in the wilderness forty years.<sup>37</sup> "This is that Moses who said to the children of Israel, "The Lobo your God will raise up for you a Prophet like me from your brethren.
