



## Acts 21:27-29 <sup>27</sup> Now when the seven days were almost ended, the Jews from Asia, seeing him in the temple, stirred up the whole crowd and laid hands on him, <sup>28</sup> crying out, "Men of Israel, heip! This is the man who teaches all men everywhere against the people, the Iaw, and this place; and furthermore he also brought Greeks into the temple and has defiled this holy place."<sup>29</sup> (For they had previously supensed that Paul had brought into the temple.) 
Gentiles into the temple and what was the consequence?

Acts 21:30-34 <sup>30</sup> And all the city was disturbed; and the people ran together, seized Paul, and dragged him out of the temple; and immediately the doors were shut." <sup>31</sup> Now as they were seeking to kill him, news came to the commander of the garrison that all Jerusalem was in an uproar. <sup>32</sup> He immediately took soldiers, and conturions, and ran down to them. And when they saw the commander and the soldiers, they stopped beating Paul. <sup>34</sup> Then the commander came near and took him, and commanded him to be bound with two chains; and he ascertain the turb because of the tumultitude cried one thing and some another. So when he could not tumut, he commanded him to be taken into the barracks.
