

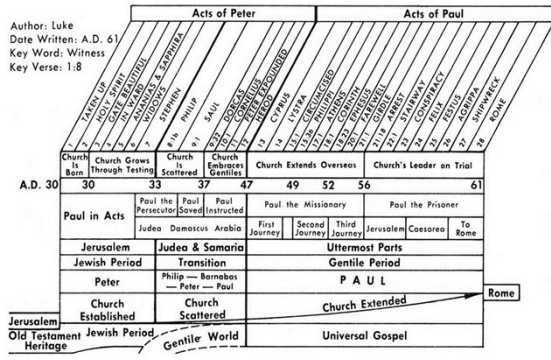

Acts 9:1-2 ¹Then Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest ²and asked letters from him to the synagogues of Damascus, so that if he found any who were of the Way, whether men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem.

- What was Saul's background?
- Why was Saul going after Christians?
- Why did Saul request authorization to travel outside of Jerusalem?
- Why was a request from the High Priest necessary?
- What does it mean that he was looking for people of the Way?

Acts 9:3-5 ³As he journeyed he came near Damascus, and suddenly a light shone around him from heaven. ⁴Then he fell to the ground, and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?" ⁵And he said, "Who are You, Lord?" Then the Lord said, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. It is hard for you to kick against the goads."

- Who was the last person to see Christ prior to Saul seeing Him here?
- What is a goad?
- Is being sincere about your religion enough?

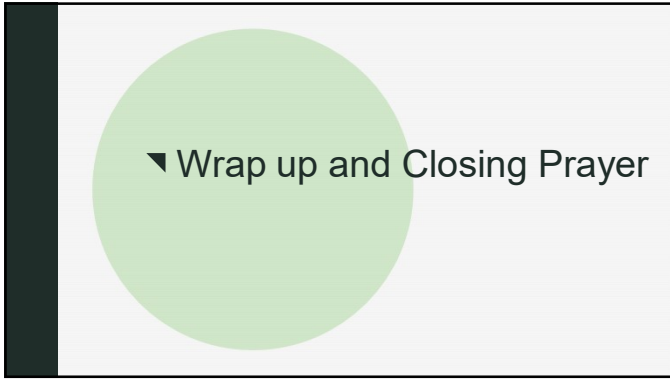

Acts 9:6-9 ⁶So he, trembling and astonished, said, "Lord, what do You want me to do?" Then the Lord said to him, "Arise and go into the city, and you will be told what you must do." ⁷ And the men who journeyed with him stood speechless, hearing a voice but seeing no one. ⁸Then Saul arose from the ground, and when his eyes were opened he saw no one. But they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. ⁹And he was three days without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

- What was Saul's response to his blindness, and did he see Jesus?
- What views have been proposed to refute Saul's conversion?
