



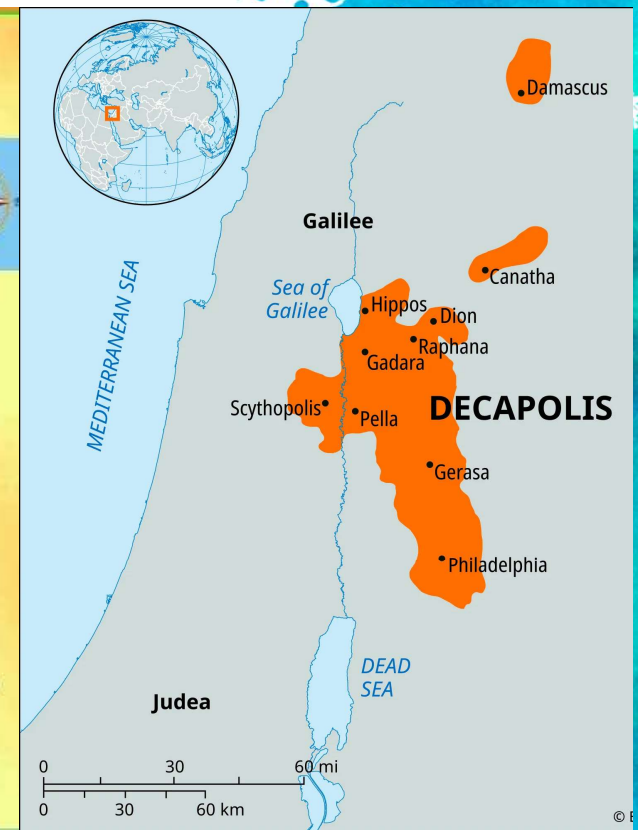
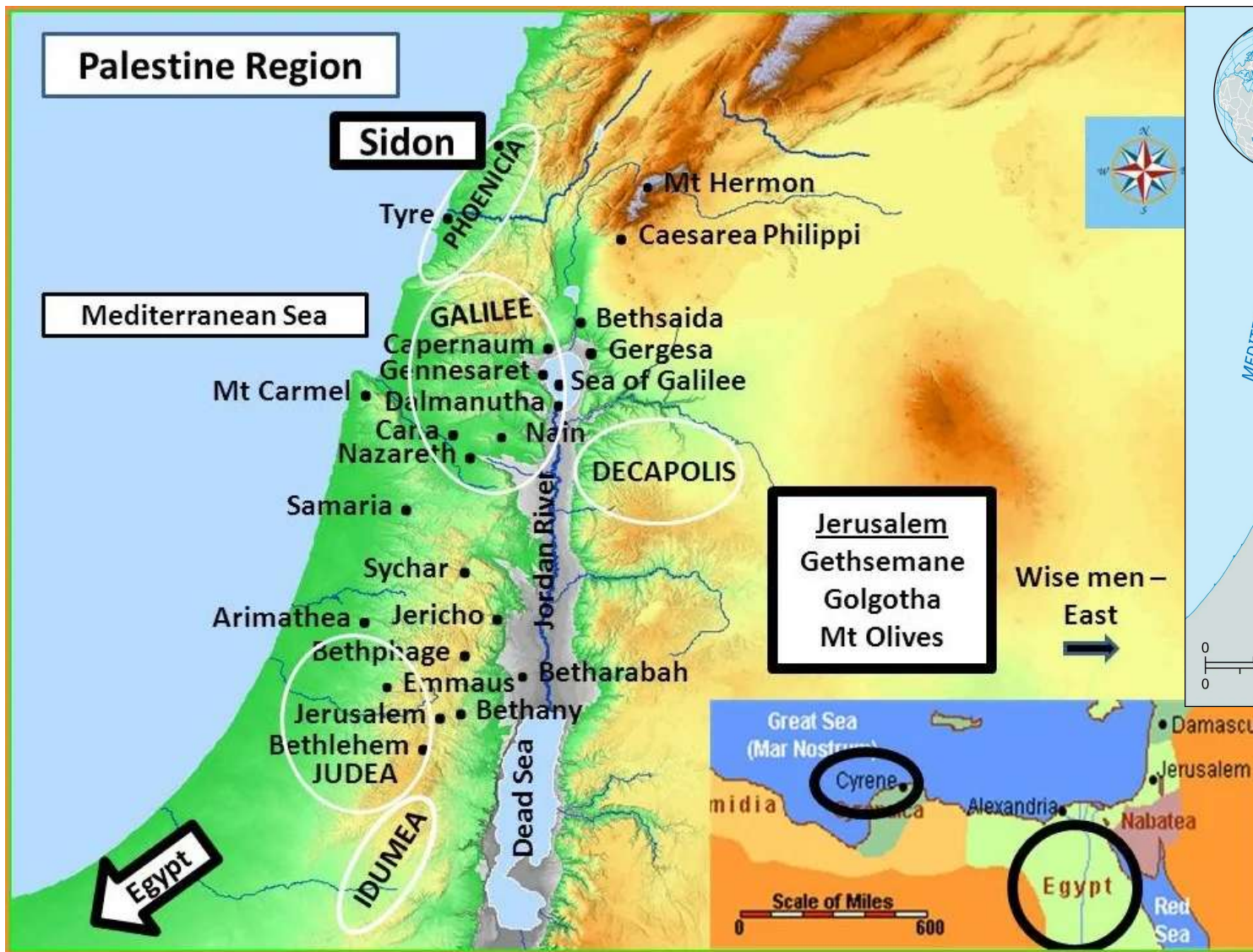

Matthew 15:21-24 ²¹ And Jesus went away from there and withdrew to the district of Tyre and Sidon. ²² And behold, a Canaanite woman from that region came out and was crying, “Have mercy on me, O Lord, Son of David; my daughter is severely oppressed by a demon.” ²³ But he did not answer her a word. And his disciples came and begged him, saying, “Send her away, for she is crying out after us.” ²⁴ He answered, “**I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel.**”

What is significant about the district of Tyre and Sidon?

What do we know about the woman that came crying out to Jesus?

How does she know that Jesus is the Messiah?

Do you find it odd that Jesus would remain silent as the woman pleaded with Him?

What were the disciples likely asking Jesus when they asked Him to send her away?

Matthew 15:25-28 ²⁵ But she came and knelt before him, saying, “Lord, help me.” ²⁶ And he answered, “**It is not right to take the children's bread and throw it to the dogs.**” ²⁷ She said, “Yes, Lord, yet even the dogs eat the crumbs that fall from their masters' table.” ²⁸ Then Jesus answered her, “**O woman, great is your faith! Be it done for you as you desire.**” And her daughter was healed instantly.

Why does Jesus state that he was sent only to Israel when he had healed other gentiles?

Was Jesus being cruel comparing her to dogs?

What is impressive about this woman?
