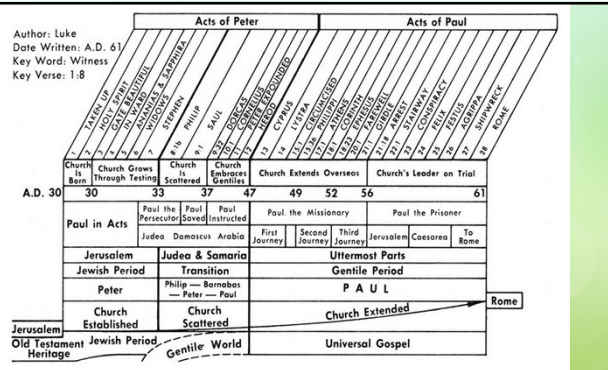

Acts 3:1-3 ¹One day Peter and John were going up to the temple at the time of prayer—at three in the afternoon. ²Now a man who was lame from birth was being carried to the temple gate called Beautiful, where he was put every day to beg from those going into the temple courts.

- What is the hour of prayer?
- Why did Peter and John continue to go to the temple?
- What is the significance of the gate Beautiful?

Acts 3:4-7 ⁴Peter looked straight at him, as did John. Then Peter said, "Look at us!" ⁵So the man gave them his attention, expecting to get something from them. ⁶Then Peter said, "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth walk."⁷ Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong.

- What is the significance of eye contact between the 3?
- What do you think that the beggar thought about the words "rise up and walk"?
- What were the characteristics of this miracle?

Acts 3:8-11 Acts 3:8-11 ⁸He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then he went with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God. ⁹When all the people saw him walking and praising God, ¹⁰they recognized him as the same man who used to sit begging at the temple gate called Beautiful, and they were filled with wonder and amazement at what had happened to him. ¹¹While the man held on to Peter and John, all the people were astonished and came running to them in the place called Solomon's Colonnade.

- Was it the man's faith that led to his healing?
- What was the source of this healing?
- What was the impact on the people witnessing this miracle?
- What was the purpose of miracles in the early church?
- Is God the only being that can heal?
- Jesus likely passed this beggar many times at this popular gate. Why not heal him earlier?
