John 6:1-15 Session 11

John 6:1-4 After these things Jesus went over the Sea of Galilee, which is the Sea of Tiberias. ² Then a great multitude followed Him, because they saw His signs which He performed on those who were diseased. ³ And Jesus went up on the mountain, and there He sat with His disciples. ⁴ Now the Passover, a feast of the Jews, was near.

- Why is feeding the 5000 so impactful to the crowd apart from just being fed?
- Were people more attracted to Jesus for what He could give them or for who He is?
- What is unique about the recount of the feeding of the 5000?

John 6:5-9 ⁵ Then Jesus lifted up His eyes, and seeing a great multitude coming toward Him, He said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread, that these may eat?" ⁶ But this He said to test him, for He Himself knew what He would do. ⁷ Philip answered Him, "Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may have a little." ⁸ One of His disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to Him, ⁹ "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two small fish, but what are they among so many?"

- Knowing what was about to happen, why would Jesus ask where they could buy food?
- Why ask Philip specifically this question?
- What does Philip's answer tell us about him?
- This is the second time Andrew has been specifically discussed. What can we learn about him?

John 6:10-13 ¹⁰ Then Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand. ¹¹ And Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks He distributed them to the disciples, and the disciples to those sitting down; and likewise of the fish, as much as they wanted. ¹² So when they were filled, He said to His disciples, "Gather up the fragments that remain, so that nothing is lost." ¹³ Therefore they gathered them up, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves which were left over by those who had eaten.

- The men numbered about 5000. What does that indicate about this crowd?
- What is the significance of Jesus choosing to involve the disciples to distribute the food to the crowd?
- Is there significance in twelve baskets being left over?
- What is the stewardship lesson directly from the mouth of Jesus to be learned here?

John 6:14-15 ¹⁴Then those men, when they had seen the sign that Jesus did, said, "This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world."
¹⁵Therefore when Jesus perceived that they were about to come and take Him by force to make Him king, He departed again to the mountain by Himself alone.

- ▀ What may have driven the crowd to make Jesus King?
- ▀ Why did Jesus depart alone into the mountains as opposed to accepting the adoration of the people?
