Christ in Matthew	Jesus, the Messiah, fulfills the prophecies, promises, types, and expectations of the Old Testament Scriptures (16:16–19; 28:18–20).			

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Matthew 14:22-24 ²² Immediately he made the disciples get into the boat and go before him to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. ²³ And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, ²⁴ but the boat by this time was a long way from the land, beaten by the waves, for the wind was against them.

Why would Jesus make the disciples leave in the boat without him?

Is this the first instance of trouble on the Sea of Galilee for the disciples?

What is likely the state both mentally and physically of the disciples in the boat before Jesus arrived?

Matthew 14:25-27 ²⁵ And in the fourth watch of the night he came to them, walking on the sea. ²⁶ But when the disciples saw him walking on the sea, they were terrified, and said, "It is a ghost!" and they cried out in fear. ²⁷ But immediately Jesus spoke to them, saying, "Take heart; it is I. Do not be afraid."

Why would Jesus allow them to struggle for so long with the wind?

Why would the disciples think that they saw a ghost on the water?

Why do you think Jesus walked to them on the water?

Matthew 14:28-31 ²⁸ And Peter answered him, "Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water." He said, "Come." So Peter got out of the boat and walked on the water and came to Jesus. ³⁰ But when he saw the wind, he was afraid, and beginning to sink he cried out, "Lord, save me." ³¹ Jesus immediately reached out his hand and took hold of him, saying to him, "O you of little faith, why did you doubt?"

Was Peter impetuous?

Why did Peter begin to sink?

What did the disciples gain through this experience?
